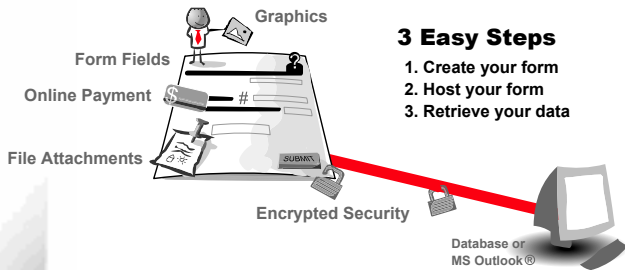

Document management and printing requirements in today's enterprises have become more demanding than ever. Quality Assurance in PDF: Your Business Critical Files May Not Be Legible in the Future

Dr.. Hans Bärfuss and Roger Reeves

PDF is the preferred processing and archiving format for millions of critical business documents that have to be retained and reproducible for years. But it is alarming how few companies are aware of the potential quality problems with PDF files or analyze the quality of their PDF documents. PDF files that are created and processed in your daily business can contain corruptions that allow the documents to be viewed and appended today, but may hinder or wholly prevent their reproducibility in the near or far future.

In this presentation we will explain when and how Quality Assurance (QA) can be applied to PDF files in different business processes, offer suggestions how to recognize and prevent or repair corrupt files, and indicate how different types of corruption may adversely affect the reproducibility of PDF files now and in the coming years.

Effective Strategies for Managing Web-Based PDF Forms

Randy Popson

The session will provide a summary of key requirements for effectively managing PDF structured content on the web. With billions of pages of PDF form content created to date and millions more created daily, effective form and data management is critical to all organizations.

This session will also outline issues and options you have as you migrate to XFA based PDF's created from Adobe LiveCycle Designer. Come see how a well planned transition strategy can help your organization. Actual implementation examples will be provided so that attendees can develop a plan of action for their organization.

PDF Forms and Database Connectivity Solutions

Franklin Garner

With great software like Amgraf OneForm Designer Plus (OFDP) and Adobe Acrobat, paper forms can be converted to PDF Internet forms (I-forms) thereby saving significant costs in printing and storage. With additional effort, I-forms can be extended into fillable, submittable containers for data capture, retrieval, presentation, and processing.

The benefits of database-connected I-forms solutions include improvements in productivity, transaction accuracy, and user satisfaction. So where's the problem?

Forms layout and design, and even the steps to insert fill fields, are typical graphic designer tasks. A non-connected PDF form is a self-contained file with everything packaged within the visual image. To make a PDF form submittable, the designer must think beyond the form image and interact with software for field data extraction and communication. Navigational panels to start and end a form filling session must also be provided. These functions are usually developed by computer programmers, and can be worrisome tasks for graphic designers.

Sessions

Adding database connectivity also introduces another layer of complexity onto I-forms.

This presentation will outline the technical issues involved in implementing an I-forms data collection and retrieval system, and show examples of successful real-world PDF I-forms systems within industry and government.

PDF Content: Strategies for Section 508 Compliance

Duff Johnson

Since 2001, Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act requires Federal government agencies and contractors to provide electronic content in a manner accessible to all users. State and local governments are following the federal lead with their own regulations to facilitate equal access to documents by disabled users. With millions of visually impaired and tens of millions of other disabled in the U.S. alone, making on-line content accessible is more than just a mandate for government agencies and their vendors, it's good business as well.

In this session, we'll focus on the strategic issues surrounding Section 508 compliance for electronic documents in general, focusing on the implications for PDF deliverables. We'll discuss the realities of making and validating accessible PDFs, and conclude with some high-level pointers on building accessibility into the content development process, no matter what format you use to publish..

Moving from Acrobat to Designer JavaScript

Thom Parker

JavaScript is the essential tool for making PDFs interactive. It is especially important for forms. Adobe is now shipping LiveCycle Designer as part of the Acrobat 7 installation. The Designer JavaScript model is completely different from the traditional Acrobat model so how can you migrate your Acrobat-based forms to the XML-based forms created by Designer? - How the JavaScript models differ.
- How to use the Designer JavaScript model.
- Where to get information on Designer JavaScript. Tips and techniques for migrating Acrobat JavaScript.
- Many live examples will be included in the companion PDF for the session for use with your own projects.

Using Acrobat 7 to Interactively Display 3D Images

Greg Smith

Although the use of 3D product design software has increased dramatically over the years, the re-use of the 3D design data outside of engineering, especially in the areas of assembly methods, service procedures, and parts catalogs, has not. The combination of text, 2D drawings, re-generated images, and paper can be an expensive, time consuming, and a painful means of communicating.

The use of interactive 3D procedures can dramatically cut down on misunderstanding, miscommunication, and mistakes compared to just 2D drawings and text used for instructions. One of the major drawbacks for 3D documentation has been the issue of distributing the 3D information. With Adobe releasing Adobe Acrobat 7.0 with 3D viewing, one of the last major hurdles has been overcome.

The session will discuss methods for generating interactive 3D PDF files, and the uses and

benefits of 3D in product documentation and literature.

Implementing Web and Print PDF Standards at a National Laboratory

Margo Stezel

The National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) in Colorado is the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) premier laboratory for renewable energy research and development and a leading laboratory for energy efficiency research. Lab staff assist DOE with a full range of energy-related activities which culminate in transferring NREL knowledge and technology to others.

In 1999 NREL's publication and print delivery workflows migrated to 100% electronic processes, including the posting of NREL publications in PDF format. The need for standards for PDFs posted on the Web and for PDFs produced for high-end print processes quickly became apparent. This led to development and implementation of Web PDF standards in 2000, the addition of the Section 508 requirement in 2001, and PDF/X-1a standards for print PDFs in 2004. Last but not least, end-user training on creation of PDFs to meet standards was offered on both Mac and PC platforms.

As public awareness of the availability of full-text PDF versions in NREL's Publication database increased, trends moved towards inexpensive quick-prints in minimum quantities and electronic-only publications. The implementation of PDF/X-1a for print PDFs and the consequent training of designers in preflight processes also helped reduced costs of printed publications.

This Case Study highlights NREL's PDF standards development and implementation processes during the past 5 years.

Using PDF to Create a Secure Engineering Workflow

Dennis Newman

This session explains a process used to take modular construction drawings from the factory through the review process and on to the regulatory agency for final approval to build.

You will see the tricks and tools used by third party reviewers to mark up and finally approve the construction drawings for factory built housing. You will see an example of how several State regulatory agencies agreed to adopt PDF as the electronic transmittal medium used to facilitate workflow in this area of the construction industry.

Also included will be a discussion of the PDF/E standard as submitted to the ISO this year for adoption, as well as information about the move to adopt Digital Signatures as a replacement to the engineering 'standard' of using a traditional 'wet stamp' on drawings.

You will see a visual demonstration of the actual review process, using a typical modular house plan set. This demonstration includes how the custom stamps are created, and the markup / review / and approval process.

While this demonstration is focused on the manufactured housing industry, the procedures are easily adapted to many engineering workflows.

Creating a Home-Grown Document Management System

Dick Vohlers

I'm responsible for an internal company document management system. The images are scanned into Acrobat, then stored into the system via a plug-ins developed using the Acrobat SDK. The scan operator enters data into a dialog created by the plug-in, and the plug-in stores that data into the database and saves the PDF file to storage. Users can retrieve images via the

plug-in, via a Web interface, or via an Audit Trail application that is also part of the system.

There are five different versions of the main plug-in for different document types, such as software contracts, legal contracts, and employee personnel files. There are different plug-ins because each automatically creates a bookmark structure when an image is first saved to storage, and because different document types have different indexing data.

In addition, there are other programs that run over the weekend using the IAC interface to implement the system retention rules.

ASRC's Exploration of NASA Re-engineering Document Imaging Workflow Inefficiencies

Scott Swidersky and Phyllis L. Benson

Undocumented, antiquated systems forced the establishment of a completely re-engineered document conversion process. The information management solution ASRC implemented, enabled an improved throughput and the ability for authorized NASA staff to access reports in searchable, PDF format online via a secure login portal. This re-engineering has presented ASRC with the ability to provide 'Scan-on-Demand' service, where NASA employees can access the report's metadata online and if the report has not yet been scanned, they can request an electronic version which is completed and accessible within three days.

IRS Dynamic CD Portfolio

Paul Showalter

The IRS has created and distributed the IRS Tax Products CD-ROM for more than ten years. The effort to assemble and disseminate thousands of tax forms and publications was incredible and often took months. Something had to be changed in the creation (compilation) process, that would improve the accuracy and timeliness of the product.

In this session, attendees will learn:

- How IRS put 1,100 tax products into a two-page, 400k PDF.
- How production time was reduced from months to two weeks.
- How the CD is now easy to navigate.
- How the CD's usability was enhanced with exceptionally fast search capability.

Development of a Custom PDF Search

Mark Czajka

The first case study is a custom PDF search developed for the Society of Plastics Engineers. Abstracts and papers were collected using a web site which utilizes activePDF to generate PDF papers from supplied electronic files. From PDFs and the database of paper information (including title, author, market segment, paper number, session number, session name and abstract), a PDF based CD-ROM was developed which includes a custom search page. This case study shows what is possible with Acrobat's search technology, and what to watch out for in Acrobat 7.

Deploying Secured PDFs on CD and the Web

Mark Czajka

The second case study is a combination of two PDF products, a CD-ROM and Web based collection of standards for American Boat & Yacht Council. The standards are protected with FileOpen Web Publisher 3. The CD-ROM features a custom search page, and the web site features a PDF collection using ARTS PDF Search. This case study shows the same product delivered using two different mediums (the Web and CD-ROM) for two different audiences (network and single users). The Web version can limit the number of concurrent users.

Adobe's Implementation of the Reader Distribution System

Lori Defurio

Adobe not only sells Acrobat, but it uses it in-house. In this case study, you will see how Adobe uses its own Form Server, Workflow Server and Document Server to manage internal processes.

Adobe Acrobat 6.0.3 Rollout for the Enterprise

Douglas Hanna

And now for the rest of the story! Follow-up to my extended presentation on Adobe Acrobat 6.0 rollout in the enterprise given at the September 2004 PDF Conference - that was still in progress.

After 13 months of development and testing, and innumerable contacts with engineers at Adobe Systems, we were able to rollout out Adobe Acrobat Professional 6.0.3 to over 3,000 associates in a weekend. What were the pitfalls, time traps and show stoppers? How did we do it? What would we have done differently? What are our plans for Acrobat 7?
